Gods, goddesses, giants, and dwarves struggle to be lords of the ring, but as Wagner's mammoth music drama unfolds, the ring's curse unleashes its vengeance.

From the opening sounds of the River Rhine's rippling waters through the majestic "Entry of the Gods into Valhalla," you'll be swept away by Wagner's magnificent music. Wagner's *Ring* creates a vivid world and a musical experience never to be forgotten.

James Conlon conducts an extraordinary cast of internationally acclaimed Wagnerians. As the chief god Wotan, Vitalij Kowaljow, a powerful Ukrainian bass, promises to "dominate every scene he is in" (*The New York Times*). Making her Company debut as Wotan's insistent wife Fricka will be Michelle DeYoung a "remarkably powerful mezzo" (*Opera Today*), who has already performed the role at The Metropolitan Opera. Other notable debuts include Arnold Bezuyen as Loge and Gordon Hawkins as Alberich. Making a welcome return from previous seasons will be Jill Grove as the earth goddess Erda, Eric Halfvarson as the giant Fafner, and Graham Clark as Mime, one of his signature roles.

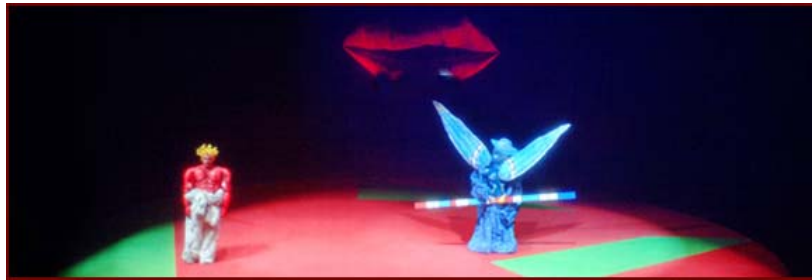


Starring Plácido Domingo, "the world's greatest Siegmund."

"You really must beg, borrow, steal, or preferably buy a ticket to see Plácido Domingo as Siegmund," exhorts *The London Times*. And who better to match his artistry than soprano Anja Kampe - when paired with Plácido Domingo at Washington National Opera, the *Washington Post* declared them "the definitive Sieglinde and Siegmund of this century's first decade." This compelling love story between the doomed hero and his soul mate features some of Wagner's most memorable music. Highlights include Siegmund's heroic "Spring Song" ("Winterstürme"), the love duet ("Du bist der Lenz"), the rousing "Ride of the Valkyries", Wotan's heart-breaking "Farewell" to his beloved daughter ("Leb wohl"), and the "Magic Fire Music" finale. James Conlon conducts a world-celebrated cast, including Linda Watson (Brünnhilde), Michelle DeYoung (Fricka), Vitalij Kowaljow (Wotan), and Eric Halfvarson (Hunding).

The third chapter of Richard Wagner's epic cycle *Der Ring des Nibelungen*.

The third part of the *Ring* cycle chronicles the heroic coming of age of the naïve yet fearless Siegfried, product of the Siegmund/Sieglinde union. Mime, brother to Alberich, has raised Siegfried ever since he lost his mother at birth, and plans to use the boy to liberate the Nibelung hoard, including the all-powerful ring. A mysterious Wanderer (Wotan in disguise) visits Mime and, after a game of riddles, hints that Siegfried is indeed destined for greatness but also will be Mime's doom. Swords are re-forged, dragons slain, treasures reclaimed, justice dispensed, a forest bird sings, and the power of the gods continues to dwindle as the hero's quest culminates in the discovery and rapturous rescue of Brünnhilde on her rocky ledge.

Richard Wagner's epic cycle *Der Ring des Nibelungen* draws to a close.

In the final opera of Wagner's epic cycle, the *Ring* cycle begins with the three Norns reviewing the thread of destiny and recalling Alberich's curse on the ring. Still smitten, Siegfried gives the ring to Brünnhilde as a token of his love before embarking on further heroic quests. He is soon duped by King Gunther and his half-brother Hagen (son of Alberich) into forgetting his love for Brünnhilde and promising her to Gunther in exchange for his sister's hand in marriage. A shape-shifting Siegfried visits Brünnhilde, forcibly takes the ring, and brings her down from the ledge to a contentious wedding feast where accusations, miscommunications, and traitorous plotting ensue. Just as Hagen's murderous plan is carried out, Siegfried recalls his true love for Brünnhilde, now fully aware of the truth also. She takes the ring from his finger, orders the construction of a grand funeral pyre, and walks into the flames to be reunited with him in death. The river overflows, the Rhinemaidens recover the ring, Valhalla burns, and the kingdom of the gods is destroyed. Brünnhilde's sacrifice has cleansed the ring and restored the natural order.

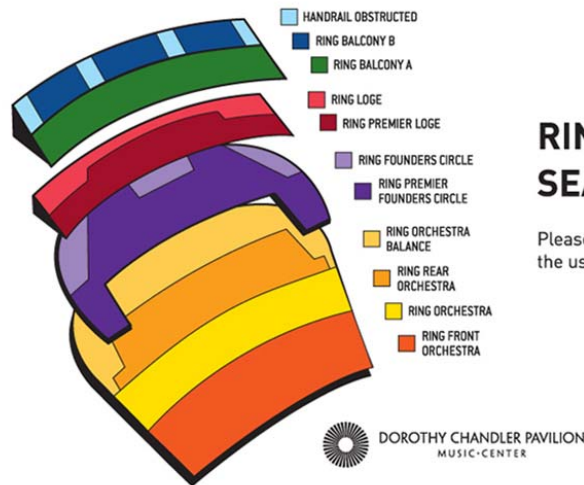

Terms for the travel packages including hotel accommodations and services. This does not apply to the Opera tickets.

Deposits and cancelation policies

We would require a deposit of \$100.00 per person, in order to confirm and guarantee all services and accommodations for the 2010 LA Opera Ring Festival. This deposit is refundable if travel arrangements are canceled prior to January 15, 2010. If travel arrangements are canceled after that date, the deposit becomes non-refundable. For those guests who confirm travel arrangements in conjunction with Ring tickets, this fee will be waived.

A deposit of 25% of total travel arrangements confirmed is due on or before March 1, 2010. If travel arrangements are canceled, this deposit becomes non-refundable.

The balance due for all travel arrangements confirmed is due on or before April 9, 2010. If travel arrangements are canceled between April 10, 2010 and the date of arrival, there will be a 90% cancelation fee.

Early departures

There will be no refund if confirmed travel arrangements are unused due to early departure.

Payment procedures

An invoice will be issued at time of booking and prior to each payment deadline. Payments by cash, check, money order, wire transfer and credit card are accepted. Payments by credit card are subject to a 3% service charge. All invoices will include wire transfer information and payment mailing address.

Cancelation by New World Travel

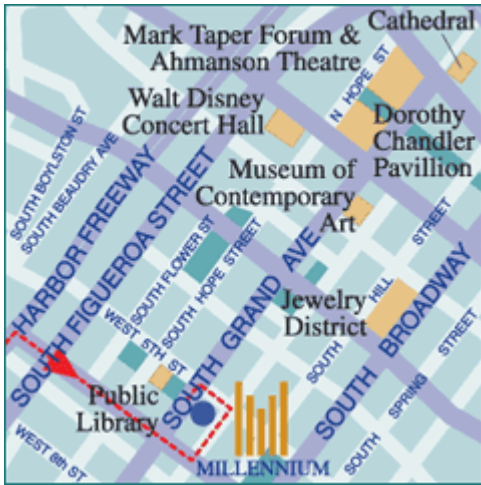
